Minutes
November 5, 2015

Call to Order

The Mayor and City Council of Fayetteville met in regular session on November 5, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall. Mayor Greg Clifton called the meeting to order, followed by Opening Prayer and led those attending in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Council members present were: Mickey Edwards, Edward Johnson, Paul Oddo, Scott Stacy, and James Williams. Staff members present were City Manager Ray Gibson and City Clerk Anne Barksdale.

Stacy moved to approve the agenda as presented. Edwards seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Oddo moved to approve the minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting of October 15, 2015. Stacy seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0-1, Johnson abstained.

Public Hearings:

Mayor Clifton called Consider #0-22-15 – Amendment to Litter Control Ordinance – Public Hearing and 1st Reading.

Chris Hindman, Director of Public Services stated the Georgia Environmental Protection Division is requiring city and county governments to tighten their Litter Control Ordinances to help keep construction wastes from impacting the environment. The requirement to update the City's ordinance is part of our National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Permit (NPDES) and part of the City's Stormwater Management Plan.

This ordinance adds the necessary requirement guidelines for construction operators to develop and implement a site waste materials control plan which is required by the NPDES permitting guidelines and it will keep us in compliance with the GA EPD requirement.

There were no public comments.

Mayor Clifton stated this is posted for 1st Reading.

Mayor Clifton called Consider #0-23-15 – Rezoning - 1231 Highway 54 West (Parcel #0521010) – 4 acres from MO (Medical Office) to C-3 (Highway Commercial) for Kamlesh Patel – 2nd Reading.

Brian Wismer, Director of Community Development stated the applicant is requesting to rezone 4 acres at 1231 Highway 54 West near Piedmont Fayette Hospital and South Sandy Creek Road. The subject property is currently zoned MO (Medical Office) and the applicant is seeking C-3 (Highway Commercial) zoning to allow for construction of a four (4) story, eighty three (83) room hotel. Ingress and egress to the property will be via the existing current curb cut located on Hwy. 54 at the west end of the property. Adjoining properties and zoning are as follows:

- To the north is Piedmont Fayette Hospital, zoned O&I (Office & Institutional).
- To the south is county property, zoned AR (Agricultural Residential).
- To the east is county property, zoned R-70 (single family residential).
- To the west is Hector's Tire Company, zoned C-3 (Highway Commercial).

The proposed hotel will further the development around the hospital and the West Fayetteville area. With the rapid growth of the film industry in Fayetteville and the hospital expansion project, both have expressed the need for a hotel in the area. The Holiday Inn Express will rent suites for approximately \$100.00 per night, according to the applicant. This price point is in line with the other hotels in Fayetteville and will bring high standard amenities to the area that are currently in demand but unavailable.

He added it is beneficial for the City to have this underutilized property developed, while providing a much needed service to the West Fayetteville area. Due to these reasons, Staff supports an approval for the rezoning request as submitted.

Mr. Wismer further stated that the concept plan submitted with this zoning application is for reference of proposed uses only, and has not been reviewed for compliance with all City codes. If approved for rezoning, development plans will be reviewed separately by the Planning & Zoning Commission at a later date.

Mr. Patel and Mr. Digby (design architect) elaborated on the plans for the hotel.

Public comments were made by Mr. Ken Steele and Mr. Al Hovey-King. Mr. Steele stated that Holiday Inn Corporate needs the City's approval for their design. He added we need to set our standards high and make this a "trendsetter" in Fayetteville. We should also have adequate landscaping for this project.

Mr. Hovey-King asked if the Highway Overlay requirements apply here, with significant buffers.

Mr. Wismer stated that based on the depth of the lot, setback is already part of the ordinance.

Ray Gibson, City Manager added that the architectural plans should come back before Council for approval at a later date, to include restaurant plans as well.

Williams moved to approve #0-23-15 – Rezoning - 1231 Highway 54 West (Parcel #0521010) – 4 acres from MO (Medical Office) to C-3 (Highway Commercial) for Kamlesh Patel, with the following conditions:

- Design architecture should fit and compliment the surrounding area
- Include setback line from the highway for the building – move 64’ back to include a 40’ landscaping buffer and 24’ cross drive
- Bring architectural plans back before Council for final approval

Stacy seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

New Business:

Mayor Clifton called Consider R-36-15 – Election Results from November 3, 2015 General Election.

Anne Barksdale, City Clerk stated the Fayette County Elections office still has provisional and UOCAVA (Military) outstanding until Friday at 5:00pm, after which time the election results will become official. Our City Charter requires this Resolution be adopted at the first meeting following the election.

She read the resolution which included the following election results:

Ms. Barksdale added, it is hereby resolved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Fayetteville, Georgia that as a result of said election, Edward Johnson is duly elected Mayor, Harlan Shirley is

duly elected Councilmember Post # 1, and Kathaleen Brewer is duly elected Councilmember Post # 2 for the City of Fayetteville, Georgia.

Oddo moved to approve R-36-15 – Election Results from November 3, 2015 General Election as presented. Edwards seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Clifton called Consider Patriot Park Landscaping Project Proposal.

Ray Gibson, City Manager stated we have the estimate from Bashert Farm and Gardens for the installation of 25 trees at the Patriot Park location. The total cost of the installation is \$13,900. Bashert Farms is proposing donating \$6,950 and requesting that the City pays \$6,950. This would be phase one of the Park landscaping transformation project as it is recommended that the City perform additional work such as the removal of the callery pear trees and the establishment of a wild flower garden. He said we will investigate these items when appropriate.

He recommended approval of the installation of the 25 trees with the City cost being \$6,950.

Edwards moved to approve Patriot Park Landscaping Project Proposal. Stacy seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Clifton called Consider Items for Surplus.

Anne Barksdale, City Clerk stated we have vehicles from our Water & Public Works departments that are ready for surplus – five from Water Dept. and four from PW Dept.

Once declared surplus, the items listed will be auctioned through GovDeals online auction.

Johnson moved to approve Items for Surplus. Edwards seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

City Manager and Staff Reports:

Ray Gibson, City Manager stated tomorrow from 9:00 – 12:00 the City will host a Community Shred Day and Electronic Recycling Day at City Hall.

He said we have received TAP funding in the amount of \$546,000 for the Hwy. 54 Bridge/Crosswalk project.

He stated the auditors will be at the City November 16th to conduct the FY 2015 audit.

Mr. Gibson also said the Economic Development Strategy Focus Group meetings were held all day today at the Fayette Chamber offices and they were very successful. He added Jay Garner did a great job facilitating and he would like to have him present at our next Council Retreat in February.

City Council and Committee Reports:

Councilmember Johnson thanked everyone for their support and votes to elect him into office as Mayor for this next term.

Councilmember Oddo thanked everyone for their support and votes for Mimi Oddo, expressing her appreciation as she was out of town.

Councilmember Edwards congratulated all of the winners in this election and he appreciated all of the support shown to him as well.

Mayor's Comments:

Mayor Clifton said he has been attending and has now graduated from the Georgia Academy of Economic Development, and he mentioned this would be excellent for other officials and staff to attend.

Mayor Clifton addressed Mayor Elect Johnson congratulating him on his election as Mayor and made statements concerning the outcome of the election.

Public Comments:

There was one public comment made by Mr. Tony Parrott concerning the recent approval of the PCD Development Agreement Amendment at the Villages, removing sprinkler requirements for single family homes.

He did not agree with the lack of sign postings about this subject and didn't feel the residents were notified properly or able to be involved in the decisions made.

Williams moved to adjourn the meeting. Stacy seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

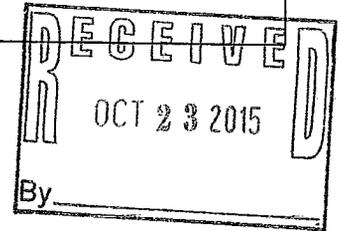

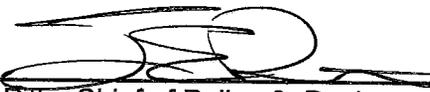

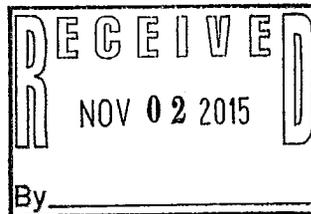

CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, GEORGIA

PREAMBLE AND FINDINGS

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville (the “City”) has determined that to meet the requirements of the federal Clean Water Act and associated National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Phase II stormwater permit (GAG610000) construction site waste must be controlled; and

WHEREAS, the City hereby adopts, ordains, and enacts the foregoing ordinance amending and modifying the City’s Litter Ordinance as follows:

**WHEREFORE THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE HEREBY ADOPTS AND ORDAINS
THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE:**

ARTICLE I

Remove and replace all of Section 42-303 with the following language.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to dump, deposit, throw or leave or to cause or permit the dumping, depositing, placing, throwing or leaving of litter on any public or private property in the City of Fayetteville or any waters in the City of Fayetteville unless:

- (1) The property is designated by the state or by any of its agencies or political subdivisions for the disposal of such litter, and such person is authorized by the proper public authority to use such property;
- (2) The litter is placed into a receptacle or container installed on such property; or
- (3) The person is the owner or tenant in lawful possession of such property, or has first obtained consent of the owner or tenant in lawful possession, or unless the act is

done under the personal direction of the owner or tenant, all in a manner consistent with the public welfare.

(b) Construction site operators shall be responsible for developing a site waste materials control plan to include acceptable measures to control construction site waste materials, to include but not be limited to discarded building materials, concrete truck wash out, litter, sanitary waste, remnant bricks and lumber, paint buckets, product packaging, remnant landscaping items, etc. Construction site operators shall be responsible for ensuring the development and implementation of an adequate construction site waste materials control plan for the duration of the construction time frame for each lot / project.

ARTICLE II

This Ordinance shall become immediately effective upon its second reading and adoption by the City Council.

ARTICLE III

The Preamble of this Ordinance shall be construed to be, and is hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.

ARTICLE IV

This Ordinance shall be codified in the City's Code of Ordinances at Chapter 42, Article VIII, Section 42-303.

ARTICLE V

The repeal of any stricken or deleted language of this ordinance of the now former language of the City ("Former Language") shall not be construed or held to repeal the Former Language as to any offense committed against such Former Language or as to any act done, any penalty, forfeiture or punishment so incurred, or any right accrued or claim arising under the Former Language, or in any way whatever to affect any such offense or act so committed or so done, or any penalty, forfeiture or punishment so incurred or any right accrued or claim arising before the herein newly enacted language ("New Language"), so far as practicable. If any penalty, forfeiture or punishment be mitigated by any provision of the New Language, such provision may be, by the consent of the party affected, applied to any judgment announced after the New Language takes effect.

ARTICLE VI

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

SUBJECT: 2016 Local Maintenance & Improvement Grant (LMIG) Program

GDOT funds are available through the FY 2016 LMIG program in the amount of \$136,458.69 as long as the City meets or exceeds the required local match requirement in the amount of \$40,937.61, which is 30%. In order to receive the funds the City must submit a proposed priority list which has a total cost which meets or exceeds the grant amount and the local match amount combined which comes to a total required amount of \$177,396.39.

Included in your packet is the proposed LMIG Priority List which includes the remaining estimated dollar amount required to mill and resurface Jeff Davis Drive North.

I request approval of the LMIG 2016 Priority List for submission to GDOT for review.

All Terms are now for 3 years beginning January and ending December.

3.3 Manner of Appointment and Term of Office. The seven (7) member Board of Directors shall be appointed by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville ("Council"); provided that one director shall be the Chair of the Fayetteville Downtown Development Authority, or his/her designee from the board of the Fayetteville Downtown Development Authority, and all directors shall be current sponsors of the Fayetteville Main Street Program. The manager of the Main Street Program shall be an ex officio non-voting member of the board. All director terms shall run from January 1st to December 31st. The Board shall consist of a chair, a vice-chair and a secretary/treasurer to be chosen by the Board of Directors of the Corporation. At each annual meeting, a number of directors equal to that of those whose terms have expired shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years. At the expiration of his/her term, any director may be re-appointed. The City Council may stagger the terms of the directors so as to provide continuity on the board.
